We hear our students are better prepared and demonstrate higher skill level than their counterparts from area trade schools. We've had a heart for some time to expand our program to include young men and women returning home after serving our country. The unemployment rate of our Veterans is alarming high. These treasured Veterans of ours deserve our help in learning a marketable trade in this booming business sector. This year, we offered an additional class exclusively for Veterans. Jerry, one of our students, heard about our class for Veteran's from his church. He was encouraged to join. He found his instructors, Dan and Jan Charlin, to be wonderful role models in addition to great instructors. He enjoyed the class so much, he never wanted it to end.

After years of depression, growing up in an abusive household, product of drug use, divorce and loss, Angela found the determination to turn her life around. She was referred to us by one of our community partners, Tarzana Treatment Center. During her four months at ReIGNITE Hope, Angela proved herself to be an intelligent and hard-working individual. She graduated our program in February and now has a new career working for DMC Power as a certified welder. Angela's future is bright. 
Financial Summary

Thanks to the generosity of our many donors, ReIGNITE Hope maintains a strong financial foundation, positioning us to give more men and women what every person needs...hope and a future.



Operating Revenue





